

Charles Armstrong is Professor of English literature at the Department of Foreign Languages and Translation at University of Agder.





CO-DIRECTOR LAUREN ARRINGTON

Professor Arrington (NUIM) is a literary critic and cultural historian. Lauren is author of 'W.B. Yeats, the Abbey Theatre, Censorship, and the Irish State' (Oxford University Press, 2010), as well as a double biography of Constance and Casimir Markievicz, 'Revolutionary Lives' (Princeton University Press, 2016). Later this year, Oxford University Press will publish Arrington's upcoming book, 'The Poets of Rapallo'.

CO-DIRECTOR CHARLES ARMSTRONG

Professor Armstrong (UiA) is the author of 'Reframing Yeats: Genre, Allusion and History' (Bloomsbury, 2013) and 'Figures of Memory: Poetry, Space and the Past' (Palgrave Macmillan, 2009).
